


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
The Precision Prenatal Non-Invasive Prenatal Test (NIPT) is a screening procedure that provides you with genetic information about your baby.

Why Precision Prenatal?


Precision Prenatal NIPT can distinguish the difference between the mother's and the baby's DNA. This ability results in:



Fewer false positives and fewer false negatives. For example, our false positive rate for Down syndrome is less than 1%, with a greater than 99% accuracy rate for detection



Highest reported gender accuracy of any NIPT^{1,2,3}



Ability to detect triploidy, a severe chromosomal abnormality that can result in serious pregnancy complications if unmonitored

What do the Precision Prenatal results tell me?

Precision Prenatal NIPT provides a personalized risk score to understand if your baby is at high or low risk for screened conditions such as Down syndrome. Similar to other screening tests, Precision Prenatal does not provide a definitive diagnosis, but helps to inform you regarding the appropriateness of future, or potentially more invasive, testing.

What does Precision Prenatal screen for?

The Precision Prenatal NIPT screens for the following chromosomal conditions:

- Trisomy 21 (Down syndrome)
- Trisomy 18 (Edwards syndrome)
- Trisomy 13 (Patau syndrome)
- Triploidy
- Monosomy X
- Sex-chromosome aneuploidies
- Fetal sex

*10 weeks counted from the date of last menstrual period. Your provider may recommend adjusted timing based on your unique clinical circumstances.

When will I receive results?

Your physician will receive your results in 7–10 business days from your blood draw. You will be contacted by your care team with a summary of your results, and afterward, full details will be made available within your secure online patient portal. Contact your Axia Women's Health care center for more information about your portal account.

How much does Precision Prenatal cost?

If your insurance is in-network with Axia Women's Health, you will likely receive some, if not complete, coverage for your screening. The cost of our test can vary depending on the screening panel selected and your specific insurance plan coverage.

To be certain, it is best to contact your insurance to understand your costs. When calling your insurance, please give them CPT code 81420 so they can verify your benefits.

If you are uninsured or unsure about coverage, please contact your care center to discuss your options. We do our best to make access to NIPT affordable, as we understand the important role it plays during a mother's pregnancy.
